Secure infants	Is when behaviour is observed under unnatural, observed conditions
Time sampling	Concern the impact of a study on a participant or an experimenter
Avoidant attachment	Seek to be close (proximity) or greet a returning parent or caregiver
Controlled observation	A note is made of behaviour at regular intervals
Event sampling	A caregiver responds in a way that creates security and comfort in the infant
Naturalistic observation	Is typical of infants who actively or passively show hostility to the returning caregiver
Insecure attachment	A note is made of specific behaviours and a count is kept of the times when they occurred
Ethical issues	Takes place in a natural environment where everything is left as it normally is.
Sensitive responding	Is when a caregiver is insensitive to an infant and the child seeks and rejects intimacy
