The aim of this activity is for you to:

- To investigate the key study (APFCC) of obedience by Stanley Milgram
- To use ICT to develop your understanding of a psychological experiment

By the end of the lesson, you will be able to:

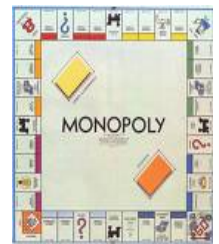
- *Describe* the APFCC of Milgram's obedience study.
- To *locate* information for AS Psychology using the internet
- *Demonstrate* that you can work as a team (useful for Key Skills Communications portfolios)

Instructions for the Activity:



You are going to work in groups of three. At any one time during the activity one person needs to be acting as a scribe for the group. You will need to keep an accurate written record of your answers for the next lesson.

One person from each group needs to come to the front desk and collect a question card for the group. The group then need to use the Internet to find the solution to the question (a list of suitable internet sites are listed below). When you think your group has answered the question, you need to show me to check its accuracy. You can then proceed onto the next question.



You **must**:

- Collect a question card.
- Locate the answer using internet sites.
- Check answer with me.
- Continue above procedure until all answers are collected.
- Ensure that you are keeping a note of your answers – take it in turns to be the scribe!
